Have You Applied Yet?

Better hurry. Our Cavendish Community Policing service is reopening on June 4 and, like much of life around here, it depends on volunteers. If you noticed the request for volunteers in the May 507 Express and tried to call, like me, no doubt you received no response from the phone number given, like me. Frustration all around – the phone stopped working last month and, as of this writing, the telephone company has not yet honoured its commitments to restore the service. Grrhh!

And Who Was Roy Lawson?

Roy and Lis were my neighbours on Mississagua Lake for more than 40 years, and there are still family members in Cavendish. If you ever knew him you would be aware that Roy had a long and successful career with the Metropolitan Toronto Police Force (from Blue Line, Canada's Law Enforcement Magazine,

chosen. Ten years later, as a Staff Sergeant, he became the Co-ordinator of the team, which already had an enviable record in preventing casualties in more than 700 hostage takings. Policing was clearly in Roy's DNA – he immigrated to Canada from northern England at age 18 and joined the Toronto Police as a cadet 2 years later. Seventeen years on, in 1976, he was a probationary Sergeant and volunteered for the department's new hostage-negotiation team. He obviously saw this as a good fit for his interests, and so did those who were recruiting candidates. Roy was among the first group of 35

forces; acted as a consultant on related issues to governments, prisons, banks and other corporations; and continued offering training to Toronto officers even after he left the team on being promoted to Inspector. So it is not surprising that he was drawn to implementing community policing in Cavendish. community trauma. 



Starting March 28th, our area endured 30 hours of freezing rain, with accumulations of over 20 mm. For nearly two days, all communications channels were down – phone, cell, internet. Tree branches and limbs crashed to the ground, followed by the clanking sounds of ice shattering. Roads and driveways were blocked, over a million people were without power, and the weather was cold and windy.

The Municipal response was immediate. Public Works and Emergency/Fire staff were out clearing roads as early as March 29th Municipality's Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) team began meeting daily, starting March 30th, to discuss operations and required actions in all areas of the Municipality. States of Emergency were declared by the County on March 31st and the Municipality on April 1st. Staff, most of whom had no power at home, returned to work on April 1st . The

Some specific measures include: There was an incredible amount of work undertaken by Hydro workers, staff and our incredible community members and partners

- Redeployment of staff and resources to deal with the event impacts
- Door to door wellness checks, as well as noting life safety hazards and access to property
- Significant road clearing and flooding checks
- Opening of warming centres in Cavendish and Buckhom
- Facility and generator checks
- Creation of brush disposal sites
- Opening of Transfer Stations, including increased hours between April 8 11, for residents
- Making sand and sandbags available at Buckhorn and 49 Depots
- Opening Cavendish Community Centre as a staging location for Hydro Crews
- Work with all levels of government on needs and emergency operations
- Daily communication updates on website and all social media channels as required
- Ongoing chipping/hauling of brush dropped off at all locations; monitoring of space, openings/closures as required
- Debrief session for Trent Lakes EOC to identify successes, challenges and improvements; SWOT analysis at County level
- Continued road clearing over next several months with sheer volume of debris
