# Volunteering for Community Policing

## Have You Applied Yet?

Better hurry. Our Cavendish Community Policing service is reopening on June 4 and, like much of life around here, it depends on volunteers. If you noticed the request for volunteers in the May 507 Express and tried to call, like me, no doubt you received no response from the phone number given, like me. Frustration all around – the phone stopped working last month and, as of this writing, the telephone company has not yet honoured its commitments to restore the service. Grthh!

But, all is not lost. You can always let the librarians know of your interest and they will pass on the information.

## What Is Community Policing?

Community policing is an initiative of volunteers in a given area to help their neighbours access information resources and, if necessary, other help from the police. I'm sure we have all enjoyed watching or reading about cheerful (or sometimes gruff) and helpful English bobbies in a village or a small urban neighbourhood. It feels like that would probably be nice to have, but, in the meantime we have each other. It makes sense to me to create an option between nothing and OPP vehicles racing up the highway.

The application form states "[t]he volunteer will field general inquiries, process requests for police services from the public and provide personal contact to the community while staffing the community policing office." Sometimes there are other activities, but volunteers do not act as police officers. And, before we do anything else, we go through a thorough orientation process.

## Where Did the Cavendish Community Policing Initiative Come From?

This program was started in Cavendish by Roy Lawson (chair) and a small collection of our neighbours (Ken Carson [vice chair], Jack Clarke, Gary Weitzel, and Don McKay). It continued until COVID inevitably caused it to be shut down (2020). By the time the COVID restrictions had ended, the deck in front of the building had become unsafe to walk on so the office could not be reopened for use. Now that deck is gone and a safe (though not universally accessible) entry has replaced it.

As you may remember, the former school portable (donated by Ernie Lockwood) lodged between the Fire Hall and the Community Centre made its appearance in 1995 when this program began. This is our office, now known as the Roy Lawson Building. Apparently, at that time, a rash of cottage break-ins led many residents to seek information about what to do next. When Roy and his committee put out the word, among the early volunteers were Deborah Pageot, Clyde Whitham, Leigh Ann McKay, Phil Clark, Lis Lawson, Howard Wood and Jack Clarke. In all, there were 20 to 25 volunteers over the years.

## And Who Was Roy Lawson?

Roy and Lis were my neighbours on Mississauga Lake for more than 40 years, and there are still family members in Cavendish. If you ever knew him you would be aware that Roy had a long and successful career with the Metropolitan Toronto Police Force (from *Blue Line*, *Canada's Law Enforcement Magazine*, November 19, 2012).

Policing was clearly in Roy's DNA – he immigrated to Canada from northern England at age 18 and joined the Toronto Police as a cadet 2 years later. Seventeen years on, in 1976, he was a probationary Sergeant and volunteered for the department's new hostage-negotiation team. He obviously saw this as a good fit for his interests, and so did those who were recruiting candidates. Roy was among the first group of 35 chosen. Ten years later, as a Staff Sergeant, he became the Co-ordinator of the team, which already had an enviable record in preventing casualties in more than 700 hostage takings.

Obviously, Roy's brand of policing was heavily weighted towards preventing problems and helping to relieve and reduce the painful situations that so often can lead to family destruction and long-term community trauma. Roy also gave lectures on hostage-negotiation and disaster planning to other police forces; acted as a consultant on related issues to governments, prisons, banks and other corporations; and continued offering training to Toronto officers even after he left the team on being promoted to Inspector. So it is not surprising that he was drawn to implementing community policing in Cavendish.

I have no doubt that all the volunteers here are just as committed to doing whatever we can to help our neighbours maintain the calm and restful atmosphere of our lives here in Cavendish.

## And Just Before You Go

Like all volunteer projects, we need to fundraise to pay our bills – like the one for the phone when it gets up and running again. The ticket price is very modest while the prize is very attractive – a 10-foot kayak (and paddle) The draw will take place at the annual Cavendish Community Centre Carnival on July 19 (more on that next month).

Think about joining me in staffing the Roy Lawson Building before too long. The commitment is to spend as little as 10 hours a month visiting with your friends and the neighbours you haven't yet met, perhaps in-person or over the phone (fingers crossed)! And the reward is real, if not always entirely knowable.

## Dates to Think About



- June 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1917 – First World War pilot William Avery "Billy" Bishop is carrying out an early morning raid on a German airfield near Estoumel, France, when he discovers and destroys several aircraft on the ground. He received the Victoria Cross for this solo attack – making him the first Canadian airman to be accorded the honour.
- June 7<sup>th</sup>, 1929 – Prime Minister John Turner was born.
- June 8<sup>th</sup>, 1905 – Ralph G. Steinhauer, the first Aboriginal person to serve as lieutenant-governor of a Canadian province, is born in Morley, Alberta. A full-treaty member of the Cree tribe, Steinhauer was educated at the Brandon Indian Residential School.
- June 12, 1983 – Christine Sinclair, one of Canada's most renowned soccer players, is born in Burnaby, British Columbia.
- June 13<sup>th</sup>, 1972 – fiddler Natalie MacMaster was born.
- June 19<sup>th</sup>, 1888 – Artist Fran Johnston is born in Toronto, A founding member of the Group of Seven, Johnston was noted for his atmospheric landscape paintings.
- June 19<sup>th</sup>, 1903 – Two years before Saskatchewan becomes a province, Regina is incorporated as a city.
- June 22<sup>1st</sup>, 1941 – actor and comedian Joe Flaherty was born.
- June 24<sup>th</sup>, 1880 – "O Canada" is first performed at a Quebec City banquet attended by the governor general, the Marquess of Lorne. - June 30<sup>th</sup>, 1948 – Singer Murray McLachlan was born.



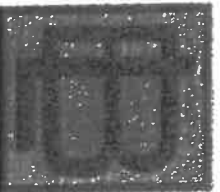

### DEPUTY MAYOR UPDATE

March 2025 – May 2025

#### HIGHLIGHTS of Trent Lakes Council Meetings

- New recycling alternatives:
  - Residents are now able to recycle Marine (i.e.: boat wrap) and Agriculture Plastics at Cavendish Transfer Station May 17<sup>th</sup> – June 1<sup>st</sup> (\$1.5 per bag for disposal)
  - 4 Moloks containers will be added at Bobcoyeon transfer site to collect and store organics material. This expansion of the program at Buckhorn is now possible with the start up of the composting facility in Peterborough. (Note: Moloks are already at the Buckhorn site.)
- The Municipality and MNRF updated a mutual Forest Fire Management Agreement that defines primary responsibility for fires in "Crown Protection Areas" and "Municipal Protection Areas", within the geographic limits of Trent Lakes. Fire Agreement
- The Municipal elections in 2026 will again be supported through internet, telephone, paper and mail-in ballots. 2026 elections
- MPP Dave Smith provided an update on Provincial support for municipalities video of MPP Smith (at minute 3)
- The 2024 Financial Audit once again confirmed the municipality is in a healthy, sustainable position. 2024 Audit Highlights:
  - Net Financial Assets - \$9.5 MM
  - Total Reserves (Capital and Operating) – \$17.6 MM
  - Revenues - \$17.1 MM
  - Expenses and Amortization - \$17.1 MM
- The 2025 Municipal Budget was approved for \$21.0 MM. 2025 Budget
  - \$11.4 will be funded through tax revenues, the balance through reserves, fees, loans and grants.
  - \$7.6 MM is for capital expenses – completion of the public works/recreation/dedicated mechanics building, vehicles, equipment, land improvements.
- County Road 507 was the subject of an extensive Road Safety Audit. 507 audit process. Key issues/hazards identified include: deteriorated road surface conditions, visibility obstructions, speeding, intersection enhancement needs, roadside hazards, legacy 3-cable guide rail systems, and unpaved shoulders. Recommendations include road rehabilitation in 2027, brush removal, speed reduction education campaign, pilot program for radar speed signs, pavement marking reviews, and intersection illumination assessments.
- The new Peterborough OPP Detachment Board is up and running. This county wide organization replaces individual municipal Police Services Boards and is responsible for local policing policies and ensuring local action plans address Board objectives and priorities. Councillor Broybrook is Board Chair.
- STR Update: Mandatory Registration is now in effect. All STRs must have submitted an application in order to be legally operating now. 56 applications have been received as of May 22<sup>nd</sup>. STR information
- Q1 Summary Report of operations and activities was published. Q1 2025 Report

Starting March 28<sup>th</sup>, our area endured 30 hours of freezing rain, with accumulations of over 20 mm. For nearly two days, all communications channels were down – phone, cell, internet. Tree branches and limbs crashed to the ground, followed by the clanking sounds of ice shattering. Roads and driveways were blocked, over a million people were without power, and the weather was cold and windy.

The Municipal response was immediate. Public Works and Emergency/Fire staff were out clearing roads as early as March 29<sup>th</sup>. The Municipality's Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) team began meeting daily, starting March 30<sup>th</sup>, to discuss operations and required actions in all areas of the Municipality. Staffs of Emergency were declared by the County on March 31<sup>st</sup> and the Municipality on April 1<sup>st</sup>. Staff, most of whom had no power at home, returned to work on April 1<sup>st</sup>.

There was an incredible amount of work undertaken by Hydro workers, staff and our incredible community members and partners. Some specific measures include:

- Redeployment of staff and resources to deal with the event impacts
- Door to door wellness checks, as well as noting life safety hazards and access to property
- Significant road clearing and flooding checks
- Opening of warming centres in Cavendish and Buckhorn
- Facility and generator checks
- Creation of brush disposal sites
- Opening of Transfer Stations, including increased hours between April 8 – 11, for residents
- Making sand and sandbags available at Buckhorn and 49 Depots
- Opening Cavendish Community Centre as a staging location for Hydro Crews
- Work with all levels of government on needs and emergency operations
- Daily communication updates on website and all social media channels as required
- Ongoing chipping/hauling of brush dropped off at all locations; monitoring of spcoe, openings/closures as required
- Debrief session for Trent Lakes EOC to identify successes, challenges and improvements; SWOT analysis at County level
- Continued road clearing over next several months with sheer volume of debris

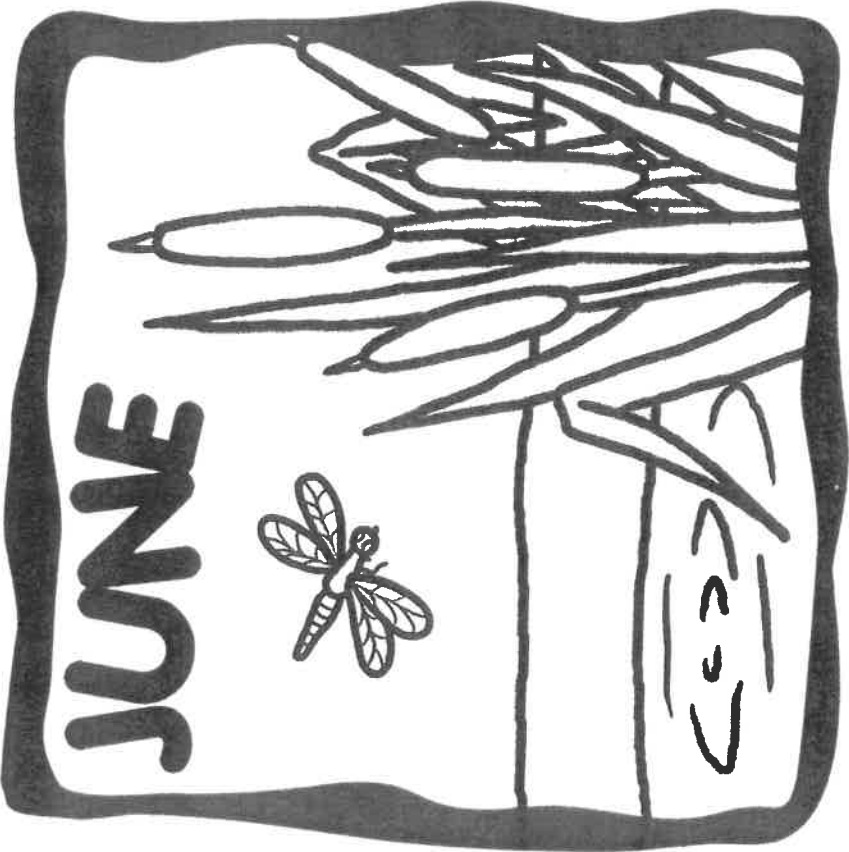
